What is explicit information?

What is implicit information?

Identify and interpret **explicit** and **implicit** information and ideas.

Select and synthesise quotations from different texts.

When something is **explicit** it is clearly stated. There is no doubt about the content or purpose of the author.

When something is **implicit** the meaning is not clearly stated. The reader has to infer (make an educated guess) what is meant.

When you **synthesise** you combine what you already know (pre-existing knowledge) with the new ideas from the text.



What might the implicit meaning be?




Beads of water dropped down his face. He only had four more miles to run
